SCHOOL FEES SCHEDULE - 2016

Mother Teresa Primary School is a Parish school under the support of the Catholic Education Office, Parramatta Diocese (CEDP). **School Fees** must be charged in order to meet the cost of wages and general recurrent costs entailed in administering schools. Fees are set by the Diocesan Schools Board and are reviewed each year. There is a likelihood of an increase approximately in line with the Consumer Price Index (CPI) each year.

DIOCESAN FEES

Catholic Schools aim to keep their fees as low as possible and can provide flexible payment arrangements for families. Students who meet enrolment criteria will not be refused enrolment due to families' genuine inability to afford school fees. There are **very significant discounts** for the second (25% reduction) and third (50% reduction) children enrolled from one family where a full fee is being paid for the eldest child. There are no Diocesan fees for the fourth and subsequent children.

Kindergarten

First child **\$1098** per year (**\$366** for Terms 1, 2 and 3) Second child **\$825**per year (**\$275** for Terms 1, 2 and 3) Third child **\$549** per year (**\$183** for Terms 1, 2 and 3) Fourth and subsequent children are free.

Year 1-6

First child **\$1419** per year (**\$473** for Terms 1, 2 and 3) Second child **\$1065** per year (**\$355** for Terms 1, 2 and 3) Third child **\$711** per year (**\$237** for Terms 1, 2 and 3) Fourth and subsequent children are free.

These concessions only apply while all the children are currently attending a Catholic Systemic School. *Fees are payable in Terms 1, 2 and 3* unless you would rather take up the Flexible Payment Plan (FPP) offered by (CEDP)

School Fees may be paid via credit card, Bpay and eftpos, cash or cheque. A Family Payment Plan (FPP) will be offered by the CEDP. This information will be enclosed in the first statement posted to families in February 2016

ADDITIONAL DIOCESAN FEES

Diocesan Levy

Payable to the school attended by the eldest child. This levy is then forwarded to the CEDP, for building works in the Diocese. (**\$735** per year payable in Terms 1, 2 and 3 at **\$245** per term)

Diocesan Temporary Residents Education Fee (DTREF)

A Diocesan Temporary Residents Education Fee will apply to new families joining the system on the following Visa numbers: 173, 401, 411, 415, 416, 418, 419, 420, 421, 422, 423, 426, 427, 428, 442, 457, 459, 476, 485, 497, 580, 600, 601, 651, 675, 676, 679, 685, 944, 956, 976 and 977 (including where any of these are the preceding visas for families on Bridging Visas 010 to 090). *The fee for 2016 is \$1,815 per student, payable in three equal instalments of \$605, in Terms one, two and three.* Families charged this fee in 2013 will continue to be charged on a per family basis to the eldest student whilst the family has continuous current students.

SCHOOL BASED FEES

INFORMATION ON SCHOOL BASED FEES 2016

Fundraising Contribution

A fundraising contribution of **\$75** is payable per child in Terms 1, 2 and 3 at **\$25** per term. This is charged in lieu of major fundraising throughout the year.

Technology Fee

A technology fee of **\$75** is payable per child in Terms 1, 2 and 3 at **\$25** per term. This fee allows us to provide children with current technology to support their learning.

Excursion/Incursion Fee

This fee covers most excursions and incursions which take place throughout the year (\$75). This fee is payable in Terms 1, 2 and 3 at \$25 per term per child.

Resource Fee

This fee is payable in Terms 1, 2 and 3 at **\$49** per term per child. This fee covers all books and materials used in the Learning Spaces throughout the year (**\$147** per year per child).
