Confirmation

Keeping with the policies of the Diocese of Parramatta the Parish's Sacramental Programme is a parish based, family centred, school supported programme. This means the programme is run through the parish and is not conducted by the schools.

Children baptised in an Eastern Catholic Rite, such as the Maronite or Melkite Rites, received confirmation at baptism. They are welcome to participate in the Sacramental Programme as a form of catechesis but cannot be 're-confirmed'. If they attend the Confirmation Mass, they can receive a blessing. Baptised Catholics who have celebrated the sacraments of Penance (Reconciliation) and Eucharist are eligible to prepare for the Sacrament of Confirmation. **Enrolment forms for Confirmation can be collected from the Parish Church while attending Mass during the period 16-17 June – 28-29 July 2018.** Enrolment forms are not available from the schools or Parish Office.

- discussed the importance of schools building a relationship with their local, state, federal Government Ministers.
- In relation to post school options:
- invite speakers into school to talk about their jobs, especially to 'break down the thought' that there are specific male jobs / female jobs. Eg. a female firefighter, a male nurse, etc.
- ask a child what they are passionate about as opposed to what they want to be when they grow up.
