In 90 seconds with the principal this week we have a review of the variety of whole school literacy and numeracy activities we achieved in one week - just a short showcase of the learning that is always our focus at Mother Teresa Primary.

"Tell Them From Me" - Community survey feedback

In May this year parents were invited to complete a survey called "Tell Them From Me'. This survey allowed parents to describe their own involvement in their child's learning at home as well as rate their perceptions of the school across various subcategories. This was the first year that all Catholic Primary Schools in the Diocese of Parramatta participated in this particular survey and parents will be invited to participate in future surveys. The TTFM survey allows us to celebrate what we're doing well and discuss perceived challenges to our school. Students in Years 4,5 and 6 were also surveyed about their perceptions of the school, learning and wellbeing. Teachers were surveyed about their perceptions regarding our areas of strength and challenge as a learning community.

Parents were very positive in their responses to open ended questions regarding the school and in ratings for particular sub-categories such as inclusiveness and safety. Parents were most positive in the rating of their own interactions at home in support of their child's learning. We received positive feedback on inclusiveness and a sense of welcome in the school and on parents being informed about learning at school. An area of challenge identified by some parents related to the school supporting learning. We accept this challenge and always hope to convey to you our core business which is education in faith, a focus on teaching and learning and the provision of a quality Catholic education for all.

As always, parents are welcome to contact the school at any time in regards to feedback, commendations and suggestions for the future. If you have any questions or concerns about your child's learning please make an appointment to speak to your child's learning studio teacher at a mutually convenient time. Child safety is greatly affected by speeding and illegal parking around school drop off and pick up zones.

The City of Parramatta teamed up with Sydney startup Spot Parking to use technology to better educate people driving their children to and from school.

The Safe School Parking Finder is a pre-journey planning tool to show drivers where they can park safely around schools. Parents new to a school, or people who don't normally drive the children will find it extremely useful.

Many drivers do not realise that there are increased fines and demerit points in active 40 km school zones. The Safe School Parking Finder can show busy parents the safe options, and avoid any risks and fines.

The Safe School Parking Finder covers over 60 schools and includes translation in over 15 community languages.
