Parents Representative Council - Keynote Speaker

Last Monday night I was joined by a group of parents from MTP at a keynote presentation at Corpus Christi Primary School at Cranebrook for a Workshop on raising happy and resilient children lead by Dr Justin Coulson. This was a very informative evening with lots of great tips on emotion coaching and providing ways of helping our children to negotiate relationships. Some of the valuable tips shared included:

- Always start with success focus on what is working ask your child what was something great that happened each day. Things will always go wrong and siblings (and school friends) will always have difficult times but always begin with the success and spend less time on the dramas.
- Emotions are contagious our children 'catch' our feelings so if we are anxious they will catch our emotion, conversely if we are calm, even in difficult situations, our children will 'catch' our clam.
- When children present challenging behaviours we can react three ways; 1) turning away and ignoring behaviour, 2) turning against and reacting negatively toward the child or more helpfully, 3) turning toward and assisting the child to acknowledge feelings and assisting them to restore relationships and complete consequences once emotions have calmed down - connect before we correct.

Thank you to the parents who were able to join me and I would recommend the PRC gatherings which are held every term.




Next week the Mother Teresa School Community will spend a week focussing, as a whole school, on literacy and numeracy activities. These are in addition to Liturgical celebrations and picnic we have on Wednesday 5th September for our Mother Teresa Feast Day celebrations. Outlined below are some of the activities we have planned.

Literacy Activities

On **Monday 3rd of September** the author <u>Sue</u> <u>Whiting</u> will be doing **writing workshops** at Mother Teresa Primary. Sue is an award winning author who will work with our students K-6 on the writing process. This is another way we can help to achieve our school writing goal for 2018.







On **Friday 7th September** we are having a "**Poem in your pocket day**". We would love everybody in our school community, students, teachers, office staff, parents, carers...EVERYONE to have a poem in their pocket. On the day our students are invited to share the poem in their pocket with as many other members of the community throughout the day as possible. This can be a poem the students themselves have written OR they could copy a poem, credit the poet and place that in their pocket.

To continue with our poetry theme on **Friday 7th September**, the whole school will be participating in a **"Slam Poetry"** presentation on Friday afternoon from 1.45pm in the undercroft area. Each grade, or a representative from each grade, will perform a poem for the school. All parents and carers are invited to come along and enjoy the poetry presentations at 1.45pm.

Numeracy Activities


The week will also feature a number of in-class, whole school and community wide mathematical tasks.

On **Monday 3rd September**, we will launch a whole school <u>Arrays Challenge</u> at morning assembly. Students will be encouraged to photograph, record and draw the arrays they come across outside of school. Additionally, students have the option to create a numeracy problem to accompany the array they have discovered. These will be collated and displayed near the school entrance. Students will have the option to continue this multiple times throughout the week. On Monday, all students K-6 will be given two copies of the Arrays Challenge recording sheet in their communication bag and spare copies will be kept by the learning studio teachers. Any completed array challenge sheets to be placed into a collection box in the student foyer.

Years 3-6 will also have access to a pop-up Google Classroom established especially for this week. Students in these grades, if they have access to devices and Google Classroom at home, can respond to the task there.

The code for students to access this classroom is vx9z8s





Monday 3rd and Tuesday 4th will also be an opportunity for students K-2 to come and try Coding using the Blue Bots and Dash/Dot. Kindergarten can come and try at recess on Monday and Year 1 at lunch on Monday. Year 2 can come and try on Tuesday at lunch time.

On **Tuesday 4th**, Parramatta Marist Year 7 STEM course has invited Stage 3 to engage with gaming projects they have been designing and testing, to teach younger students introductory geometry. The 'Geometry through Gaming' event will occur in the Morley Centre.

On **Thursday 6th and Friday 7th** will be a chance for students 3-6 to come and try <u>Coding</u> <u>using Swift and Scratch Jnr</u>.

On **Thursday 6th**, there will be a <u>whole school numeracy provocation</u> installed on the playground for the entire day. Learning studios will visit the installation and engage by recording, wondering and responding to the prompts to extend mathematical thinking. Parents may also visit and engage with installation after school until 4:30pm.


